This is an Important Notice. Failure to Respond to This Notice Could Result in Serious Legal Consequences.

Dear Mr. Graves:

The Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Waste Site Cleanup (the Department), as a result of completing its technical review of your Tier IC Permit Application, submitted on your behalf by D'Amore Associates, Inc., and review of the record file indicates that response actions at the above-referenced site are not in compliance with one or more laws, regulations, orders, licenses, permits, or approvals enforced by the Department. Therefore, the Department cannot process your permit application until these noncompliant issues as described herein are addressed.

Attached hereto is a written description of: (1) each activity referred to above, (2) the requirements violated, (3) the action the Department now wants you to take, and (4) the deadline for taking such action.

If you fail to come into compliance by the prescribed deadline(s), or if you otherwise fail to comply in the future with requirements applicable to you, you could be subject to legal action.

The Department is authorized to take any one or more of the following actions against you for failure to comply with the requirements imposed by M.G.L. c. 21E and the Massachusetts Contingency Plan, 310 CMR 40.0000:

- Imposition of double the amount of permit fees otherwise owed;
- Assessments of up to three (3) times the amount of all response action costs incurred by the Department (refer to the Notice of Responsibility for additional information), plus sanctions for failure to perform response actions under the MCP;
- Assessment of interest on costs incurred at the rate of twelve percent (12%), compounded annually;
- Assessments for damage to natural resources;
- Placement of liens on all property located in the Commonwealth, with authority to foreclose;
- Initiation of civil judicial action brought by the Attorney General; and/or
- Initiation of criminal action prosecuted by the Attorney General.

In addition to the above list of prospective legal actions, the Department may assess a civil administrative penalty for every day from now on that you remain out of compliance with the requirements described in this Notice of Noncompliance.

If performance of the necessary response actions is beyond your technical, financial or legal ability, you should promptly notify the Department in writing of your inability in accordance with Chapter 21E, subsection 5(e), and 310 CMR 40.0172. An adequate demonstration of technical, legal, or financial inability could provide you with a limited defense to an action by the Commonwealth for recovery of two to three times the Department's response action costs, as well as a limited defense to the Department's assessment of civil administrative penalties.

DESCRIPTION OF NONCOMPLIANCE AND OF THE REQUIREMENTS NOT COMPLIED WITH:

On July 23, 1996, the Department received a Tier IC Permit Application. As specified in the Massachusetts Contingency Plan, 310 CMR 40.0703(1)(a) and (d), a completed transmittal form for Permit Application and Payment and the applicable permit application fee must be included within the Tier I Permit Application for the Department to process the application. Since you did not submit the Permit Application Fee at the time you submitted your application, the Department has determined that you have failed to properly tier classify your disposal site in accordance with 310 CMR 40.0501 (5).

In addition, Non-Aqueous Phase Liquid (NAPL) equal to or greater than 1/2 inch in thickness exists on-site. This is a condition that requires an Immediate Response Action pursuant to 310 CMR 40.0412(2).

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN, AND THE DEADLINE FOR TAKING SUCH ACTION:

Submit to the Department the applicable permit application fee (\$3550) and the associated transmittal form by March 5, 1998.

Submit to the Department by April 5, 1998, an Immediate Response Action Plan in accordance with 310 CMR 40.0414 to address the NAPL.

This is a request under the Massachusetts Freedom of Information Act, G.L. c.66, §10, for disclosure of all documents in the possession or control of the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection ("DEP") or any official, employee or agent thereof, which pertain, refer or relate to the property owned by Robert L. Graves and Shirley H. Graves and located on Uncas Avenue in Oak Bluffs, Dukes County, Massachusetts, which was formerly operated as a retail Texaco gasoline station (the "Site"). By way of example but not limitation, the following particular categories of documents are requested:

- 1. All documents relating to any release or threat of release of oil or hazardous materials at or from the Site.
- 2. All documents relating to any assessment, containment or removal actions taken in response to a release or threat of release of oil or hazardous material at or from the Site.
- 3. All documents relating to any work performed by any waste management, environmental or engineering expert or consultant, or any response action contractor, concerning the Site.
- 4. All reports, studies, surveys or analyses concerning the Site.
- 5. All documents relating to any actions taken by DEP in connection with the Site.

- 6. All documents relating to any notices, permits, approvals or authorizations given to or issued by DEP concerning the Site.
- 7. All correspondence between DEP and Mr. and Mrs. Graves or any other person or entity concerning the Site.

- 9. All documents relating to the liability of any person or entity for response costs or damages in connection with any release or threat of release of oil or hazardous materials at or from the Site.
- 10. All documents relating to the actual and anticipated costs of response actions in connection with any release or threat of release of oil or hazardous materials at or from the Site.

Gentlemen:

The Department of Environmental Quality Engineering, on February 13, 1989, received notification on your behalf from Mr. Craig Saunders, that a release of gasoline had occurred at the above referenced location.

Mr. Saunders reported that he had been engaged by you to conduct a "21E" site investigation of the above location. The investigation which consisted of soil vapor analysis of the underground storage tank area and installation of monitoring wells revealed the presence of gasoline contaminated soils and free phase petroleum product on the ground water.

Mr. Saunders indicated that he believed the release was on-going and may be from the tank storage and distribution system which is greater than 30 years old. A Department representative advised Mr. Saunders to conduct hydrostatic tank testing to locate the source and abate the leak or to empty all tanks of the product. Mr. Saunders indicated he would advise his client to empty all tanks.

These conditions constitute a release of oil at or from the site. prevention and/or mitigation of such a release is governed by M.G.L., Chapter 21E, the "Massachusetts Oil and Hazardous Material Release, Prevention and Response Act," and 310 CMR 40.000, "Massachusetts Contingency Plan" (MCP).

On February 23, 1989, this office received the above referenced 21E investigation concerning the Graves Texaco, Uncas Avenue property. A review of the site investigation report submitted indicates that the report substantially fulfills the requirements of a Phase I - Limited Site Investigation and identifies that an imminent hazard may exist at this site.

This letter is to inform you that:

- 1. Based on information available to the Department of Environmental Quality Engineering, the Department has reason to believe that Graves Texaco is a responsible party with liability under M.G.L., Chapter 21E, Section 5(a)(1). The nature of this liability is joint and several without regard to fault; and
- The Department is authorized, pursuant to M.G.L., Chapter 21E, Section 4, and 310 CMR 40.171, MCP, to arrange for or to take actions which it deems necessary to respond to the release should you fail to perform response actions in an appropriate and timely manner.

Your liability noted in one (1) above may include:

- a. Administrative costs incurred by the Department in handling this matter (in simple spill cases, administrative costs incurred by the Department prior to formal legal action are at least \$1,000);
- b. Interest charges on the total liability at the statutory rate of 12% compounded annually;
- c. Treble costs (i.e., three (3) times the total amount of response costs the Department incurs); and
- d. All damages for the injury, destruction or loss of natural resources due to the release.

The liability constitutes a debt to the Commonwealth. The debt, together with interest, creates a lien on all of your property in the Commonwealth. In addition to the foreclosure remedy provided by the lien, the Attorney General of the Commonwealth may recover that debt or any part of it in an action against you. You may also be liable under M.G.L., Chapter 21E, Section 11, for up to \$100,000 in fines or penalties for each violation of Chapter 21E as well as for additional penalties or damages pursuant to other statutes or common law.

The Department requires a written response within fourteen (14) days of your receipt of this letter indicating whether you intend to take the necessary response actions in lieu of the Department. The Department also requires that you contract with a consultant knowledgeable in the area of hydrogeological investigation and uncontrolled hazardous waste site assessment and abatement. The Department hereby requests that, within 30 days of your receipt of this letter, your consultant submit to this office a report identifying whether an imminent hazard as defined in 310 CMR 40.542 actually exists at this site and detailing the actions necessary to contain, remove or otherwise abate the imminent hazard which may be present.

If an imminent hazard is identified, any and all necessary actions must be initiated within sixty (60) days of your receipt of this letter and with the prior written or verbal approval of this office. You are also requested to complete the enclosed Interim Site Classification and Preliminary Assessment Forms and return them with the above referenced report.

If the Department does not hear from you within the times specified above, or if persons acting in your behalf fail to act within the prescribed times, the Department will commence response actions and expect to recover from you to the extent of liability set forth above.

Please find enclosed completed copies of the Preliminary Assessment Report and the Interim Site Classification Form for the Graves Texaco Site. It is not possible, at this time, to describe the extent of product release on or off site, and consequently I have not attempted to classify the site

In way of review, the following procedures have taken place on site since your March visit:

- 1. A Hydrostatic test of the underground storage tanks was conducted during the last week of March, and these tests indicated substantial leakage from one of the 1000 gallon tanks.
- 2. The two (2) 1000 gallon gasoline tanks and the 2000 gallon diesel tank were removed during the first week of April, 1989. The 1000 gallon tank nearest the pump island contained a large hole at its base.

If there is any additional information that you require please don't hesitate to contact me.
