My name is Jeffrey LaBell and I am writing in support of the Martha's Vineyard Shipyard Marina project proposal for Lagoon Pond.

I have been a boater on Vineyard waters since 1987 and I am a lifelong Island resident employed by the town of Oak Bluffs. I own property which has deeded Lagoon Pond access. Additionally, I serve on the Oak Bluffs Harbor Advisory Committee.

In early October I met with James Hale, and he informed me of this proposal for a possible new marina. I fully support this proposal, as I see a 48-slip marina for the backside of the Shipyard in Lagoon Pond benefitting a large part of the Island community.
