Dear Commissioners:

I am pleased to confirm Sheriff's Meadow Foundation's commitment to conserving Pimpneymouse Farm in Edgartown.

Sheriff's Meadow Foundation will conserve 84 acres of this property, and the Martha's Vineyard Land Bank Commission will conserve an abutting 87 acres.

The conservation of this land will protect pitch pine forests, oak woodlands, dense groves of beetlebungs, farm fields, grassy meadows, and the largest salt marsh on Martha's Vineyard. The land offers habitat for a variety of rare species. The land will provide for a significant network of trails and trail connections, all of which will be open to the public. Conserving this land protects productive farmland and also working forestland, as much of the land to be conserved is the subject of a Chapter 61 Forest Management Plan. Our work is supported by donations and by a Landscape Partnership Grant from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Conserving Pimpneymouse Farm is clearly within the mission of Sheriff's Meadow Foundation, which to conserve the natural, beautiful, rural landscape and character of Martha's Vineyard for present and future generations.

We will complete the purchase once the Martha's Vineyard Commission and Edgartown Planning Board have approved the subdivision.
