Dear Paul,

I am writing today in support of the upcoming consideration by the LUPC that the Goodale Sand and Gravel Pit be considered a DRI by the Martha's Vineyard Commission.

First of all, I agree with all the questions presented to the Oak Bluffs Selectman.

Secondly, this property should be a DRI because of the increase in intensity of use. The new (towering) tower holding asphalt and spewing asphalt toxic fumes and particulate matter over Iron Hill Farm and all surrounding properties is such an increase in use and intensity that no one can measure its effects. The so called machine should be permitted, regulated and tested for toxic waste.
