To the Members of the Oak Bluffs Planning Board & Martha's Vineyard Commission,

I have been an Oak Bluffs homeowner for over 40-years and am blessed to raise a daughter here who attended its school and graduated from the MVRHS. My daughter was active in several sports and spent many hours on the current sports field. The sound scientific information available should be sufficient, incontrovertible evidence to rule against approval of the indelible toxicity of the proposed area's elements. I would not allow my daughter to play on such a field, and I cannot believe that any responsible parents would consciously do so today.

Thus, I want to express my concern regarding Martha's Vineyard Regional High School's proposed plastic field. As an environmental and climate advocate, I understand that converting a natural grass field to a plastic one runs counter to the environmental and climate protection community's collective goals and sends the wrong message to today's youth.

Now, more than ever, we understand that our planetary health depends on decisions large and small. We know we must break our addiction to the fossil fuel industry and instead invest in our soil to help it capture as much carbon as possible. We know we need to avoid using materials that further contribute to global warming and instead use plants to lower surface temperatures.
